Our experiences build genuine appreciation for Aboriginal culture, centre truth-telling and reconciliation, and create real moments to walk together towards a more unified future.



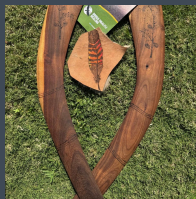

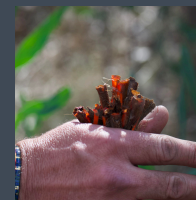
